About the Tenebrae: The word Tenebrae can be translated to "darkness" or "shadows" Centered around the Matins, scriptural readings and Lauds of the last three days of Holy Week. The traditions regarding this service go back at least to the ninth century. Originally celebrated after midnight, the candles were extinguished only the "Christ Candle" remained. The participants would leave the church in darkness meditating on Christ's betrayal, agony and death.

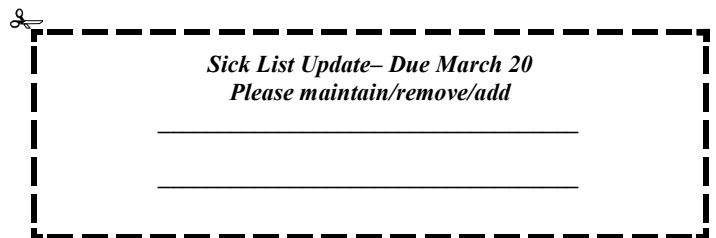
